Residential Home Improvement Grant Program

A point of emphasis for our City Commission is redevelopment and improvements in Leesburg. As part of this effort, the Commission recently approved a new Residential Home Improvement Grant program. This grant seeks to encourage our residents to improve the facades of their homes.

This program is an extension of our commercial grant that helps businesses with improvements to their buildings and signage. However, in this instance, the Commission wants to assist private homeowners by providing a 50% grant match up to \$5,000 for qualifying home exterior improvements. Projects that may be eligible for the grant include painting, siding and window upgrades.

Work Continues on Downtown Master Plan

In an effort to continue redevelopment activities in downtown Leesburg, the City is developing a Master Plan for the area to create a unified community vision for improvements in the this corridor. The plan will identify



infrastructure improvements, public policies and on-going programs to reinforce downtown's role as the heart of the City.

GAI Consultants was selected by the City Commission to help create this important planning document. Community workshops have been held and work is ongoing to incorporate input and ideas from various stakeholders. It is anticipated that the Master Plan will be completed by the end of the year.

Budget Highlights for Fiscal Year 2020

The City Commission and staff have worked diligently to establish the annual operating budget for Fiscal Year 2020, which begins on October 1, 2019. This year's total budget will be approximately \$180 million.

Of the total budget, the General Fund comprises about \$30 million or 17% of all the services provided by the City. It is most recognized for governmental services which include police, fire, library, streets maintenance, parks and recreational programs.

To provide these services, the FY 20 Budget proposes to maintain the current millage rate of 4.2678 mills. While this is a very slight tax increase, the General Fund highlights fire services modifications by adding 3 new additional fire fighter positions and several capital improvement projects such as allocating funds for a new aquatic facility, a Teen Center to benefit our youth and additional slips at Venetian Cove Marina. The budget also includes a provision to partner with Lake County in addressing the issue of homelessness.

In our enterprise funds, which are made up of water, sewer, solid waste, gas and electric services, the budget totals nearly \$112 million. Providing utility services to the Leesburg region makes up the lion share of the City's operations. In fact, the single biggest annual expense is the purchase of energy from the Florida Municipal Power Agency which is \$42 million - almost 25% of the entire budget.

This year's utility allocations seek to keep competitive rates for our customers and improve our utility systems by planning the replacement of four transmission transformers, making improvements to our wastewater treatment plants and expanding the natural gas system.

The City Commission's progressive goals and fiscal responsibility have earned the City recognition from the Florida Government Finance Officers Association with award winning budgets and financial statements for the past 21 years.

Plans Move Forward for New Aquatic Center

The City Commission has approved two big steps in the process to construct a new aquatic center to replace the aging Dabney pool and recently demolished Venetian Gardens pool.

Canal Street was chosen as the location for the new center. The 2.75 acre site was selected for a number of reasons. It conforms with the Commission's goal to use redevelopment as a tool to help revitalize the city. The central location provides a link between several marque areas of the community. The location is convenient to SR 44 giving it the ability to host events and be a regional attraction.

CPH, Inc. was selected to design the new facility. The initial plans include a lap pool, zero entry pool with a slide and a bath house. Although still in the preliminary stage, the design phase is progressing.

It is anticipated that construction will begin in Spring 2020.
