Mandatory Boil-Water Notice in Effect for Area Near Downtown Leesburg

LEESBURG, FL – Crews in Leesburg have successfully repaired a water main break in the water distribution system connected to the elevated water tower located on North College Street between West Main Street and High Street.

The City of Leesburg Public Works Department has issued a Mandatory Boil-Water Notice for homes and businesses in the following area:

- The affected area extends from North 13th Street to Thomas Avenue (east to west) and from Center Street and Montclair Road to Vine Street (north to south):

The notice is in effect for any home or business that experienced a loss in water service or a severe drop in water pressure. Boil all water used for drinking, cooking, making ice, brushing teeth, or washing dishes. Hold the water at a rolling boil for at least one minute before using it.

The boil-water notice will remain in effect until two consecutive days of a Bacteriological Survey shows that the water is safe to drink. The City will provide notification when the Boil-Water Notice has been rescinded.
